FAITH

Faith is central to the education children receive at Christ the King Catholic School. Classes take turns planning and leading prayer service during Monday morning assemblies. In addition, grades 3rd – 8th host Friday morning school Mass accompanied by our youth choir. The seasons, Sacraments and holidays of the liturgical calendar (i.e., Lent, Easter, Advent and Christmas) are actively celebrated and students receive classroom visits from Monsignor Paperini.

ACADEMICS

During the formative elementary school years, the curriculum is focused on ensuring that critical skills related to reading, writing and mathematics are mastered. As children mature into middle school students, they begin applying skills to expand student knowledge and help them develop critical thinking skills. Aimsweb* and Renaissance Learning tests are conducted three times a year to measure each child's academic progress in reading and mathematics. In addition to core academics, students receive instruction in Religion, Spanish, Art, Library & Media, Music, PE, and integrated 1:1 technology using iPads.

COMMUNITY

The Community at Christ the King Catholic School has a long and deep history. In fact, we recently celebrated our 50th anniversary! Many current students have parents who are alumni of the school. New families find they quickly become integrated into the community by participating in events like the annual school auction, CYO athletic events, and fun school community events such as movie nights, student and parent dances, Blazer games, school picnics, and volunteering at Parent Community Organization events.

SERVICE

Service to the community is an important component of a child's education at Christ the King Catholic School. Children experience the joy of making a difference in the lives of others in a variety of ways throughout the year with food drives, collecting warm clothing and personal hygiene products for local homeless shelters, and fund raising for cancer research to name only a few.
