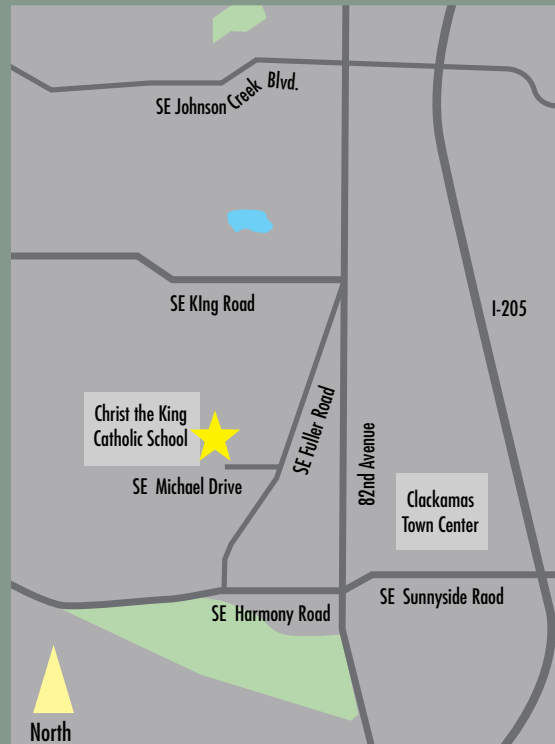


- Located on 13 beautiful acres adjacent to La Salle Catholic College Preparatory and minutes away from I-205.

## C.T.K. F.A.C.S. FAITH

The teachers, staff and families at Christ the King Catholic School provide a warm, supportive environment where children are encouraged to make the most of their God given talents. The foundation of our school is our Catholic identity and our religion curriculum. Every week begins with a student led schoolwide prayer service and all students attend weekly Mass. Opportunities for prayer and reflection

are incorporated into each school day and every grade has daily religion class.



## ACADEMICS

The curriculum, which typically exceeds state standards and benchmarks, includes Language Arts, Social Studies, Math, Science, and Religion. In addition, courses include Library/Media, Art, P.E. Spanish, Music and 1:1 integrated technology. Schoolwide Learning Expectations (SLE's) reflect the school's mission statement and philosophy of creating students who are: Spiritual People, Lifelong Learners and People of Integrity. Our mission statement ensures students experience an environment that is gospel centered and service oriented. SLE's are incorporated in daily lessons, reflected in lesson planning and modeled by all our staff members. Students are encouraged to reflect on SLE expectations and are acknowledged for the positive choices they make during their school day.

## COMMUNITY

Christ the King Catholic School has a very active school and parish community. The Parent Community Organization sponsors social events throughout the year. The Catholic Youth Organization provides opportunities for students of all ability levels to participate in athletic programs, including track and field, basketball, volleyball, football, and swimming. The school works in numerous ways to support the Open Arms/Helping Hands ministry to aid needy families in our neighborhood.

## SERVICE

Students at Christ the King Catholic School perform numerous service projects throughout the year. Projects include collecting food for the St. Vincent De Paul Food Bank, raising funds for local homeless shelters and collecting donations for cancer research, to name only a few. Middle school students perform a minimum number of service hours in the community as a graduation requirement.
